Singing Nursery Rhymes helps young children to develop vital pre-reading skills as they gain an awareness of rhyme, alliteration and story sequence. Since starting Pre-School we have been learning three Nursery Rhymes - Humpty Dumpty, Incy Wincy Spider and Hey Diddle Diddle. For this week's Hometask we are giving you a booklet of these Nursery Rhymes and the resources to make some puppets.

Share the rhymes with your child. You may have to sing them several times in order for them to be able to sing them confidently? You can make the stick puppets with your child and use them as you sing the Nursery Rhymes.

Sing the nursery rhyme and miss out words. Can they fill in the missing words - especially the rhyming word, eg Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall, Humpty Dumpty had a great
