
On Monday we cut open our pumpkins and talked about what we could see inside. The children were eager to put their hands in although it was very slimy!!

Mathematics:

This week we have subitising amounts of 1 and 2 (recognising an amount of objects without having to count them). The children were really good at saying the amount even when the objects were far apart. We then went onto talk about how we knew it was 2 because:

"1 and another 1 makes 2 altogether"




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Dates to Remember:

Therefore, today we looked at tomatoes and carrots and went onto try both tomato and carrot soups. The children talked about their preferences and the tomato soup proved to be the most popular.
