Remote Education Plan 2021-2022, From 20th September 2021 UPDATED 31st JANUARY 2022

At Sherdley Primary School, our main form of communication with parents/carers is our school app, we also use Microsoft Teams to communicate with parents and children. In the event of children having to isolate due to a positive coronavirus test we will implement our Remote Learning Plan at Tier 1. Should there be a need for a year group cohort to isolate we would move to Tier 2. In the unfortunate situation that school has to close then we would move to Tier 3. For Tiers 2 & 3, teachers will update their class Teams page daily, set pupils' work and provide feedback, when appropriate. Hard copies of pupils' work can be collected/delivered/posted to accommodate families with special circumstances.

Timetable for Tier 2 & 3

Teachers will provide a weekly timetable with a summary of each lesson that will take place. Links will be provided in this timetable to where parents and children can find the online teaching videos and resources for each lesson.

The expectation of lessons will be:

- Daily reading time
- Maths lesson at least 4 times per week (in KS1 & 2)
- English lesson at least 4 times per week (in KS1 & 2)
- Daily phonics lesson (Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1)
- Weekly spelling and times tables lesson / test (Key Stage 2)
- PE session online, 3 per week
- A range of foundation subjects per week (science, history, geography, music, computing, art, RE, PSHE / Mental Health)

Content for Maths

The White Rose Maths scheme is followed across school and White Rose Maths have published home learning videos and resources that link to the same sequence of lessons being used in school. In the event of a partial or full closure the teacher will inform parents which lessons the class are working on in school so the home learning videos and resources can be used; The Oaks National Academy videos may also be used. Teachers may also upload their own input video that can be uploaded to Teams. For KS2 there may be additional links provided to access Century.tech.

Content for Phonics

In the event of a full or partial closure, teachers will be able to record a video of the daily phonics lesson for children to watch at home. In the case of an individual child self-isolating, the teacher will inform parents which resources to access, or work will be sent via Teams, as appropriate.

Content for English

In the event of a full or partial closure, teachers may record a video of an input, or use an Oaks National Academy video for the English focus each day for children to watch as an input session. Phonics will be a focus for Early Years and KS1. KS2 Teachers will continue providing spelling resources for the spelling pattern; handwriting activities will be set each week for KS1. For KS2 there may be additional links provided to access Century.tech.

Content for Other Subjects

As well as English and Maths, there will be a lessons provided for foundation subjects each week. This will follow the same schemes that are being followed in school. In an event of a full or partial closure, the school curriculum will use either the Oaks National Academy lessons when topics match our Curriculum Map, or teachers will provide an input video. For the Oaks National Academy no log in information is needed, but a link needs to be provided for pupils. Work completed can be submitted via Teams. Where they are not available, teachers will make a video to teach the objective and then set learning tasks for the children to complete and submit. Subject based knowledge organisers may also be provided by class teachers. For KS2 there may be additional links provided to access Century.tech for Science.

Contact with Teachers

In the event of a full or partial closure, teachers will hold daily whole class live sessions via Microsoft Teams (Office 365). The purpose of these will be for the children to all be in contact together as a class; for a morning register to be taken; for the teacher to summarise the learning for that week and for children to share some of the work that they have done.

Staffing

A class teacher who is self-isolating (their class is in school), but fit for work, will either deliver a live input lessons remotely, or record one that can be sent into school via Microsoft Teams, whilst being supported in class by a suitable member of staff. This will help the pupils to remain on track and provide consistency for the children. Staff will also take their PPA entitlement during this time.

Access to Technology at Home

In the event of a full or partial closure (Tier 2 & 3), an online form will be sent out to parents via the app to establish the requirement for a school device to support home learning.

Logins to Online Learning Platforms

The school subscribes to several online learning resources, which can be accessed at home. It is essential that children and parents have access to all the relevant login details from the start of the school year, so that they are immediately available in the event of a closure of self-isolation. The login details will be sent through the school app, or made available on the school website.

Login details should be provided for:

- Microsoft Teams
- Century.tech for KS2 pupils only
- Times Tables Rockstars (Y1-6)
- White Rose Home Learning videos, no login details needed
- Oxford Owl teachers to set up a class login
- Reading Plus for KS2
- Go Read for recording reading in and out of school (replaces the paper version of the reading record)
- The Oaks National Academy online

Feedback on Work

Feedback should be given to work sent in on Teams.

Non-Engagement with Remote Learning in Tier 2 & 3

- 1. After <u>3 days</u> of non-engagement class LSAs should communicate with the parents via a phone call to establish a reason for non-engagement this should then be followed up on day 4, if there is still no engagement then on day 5 class teachers will need to make contact. On day 6 if there is non-engagement then it should be escalated to the Attendance Officer, Cath Eccleston. At day 8 of non-engagement the SLT should be informed.
- 2. If parents are not answering the phone or emails, a referral will be made by class teachers to the Attendance Officer/ SLT, who may carry out a home visit.

Revised Remote Learning Plan – From Monday 20th September 2021 UPDATED 31st JANUARY 2022

The following plan/timetable will be implemented should a class/year group go into Tier 2, or the whole school goes into Tier 3.

Based on guidance from the DfE the KS2 (Y3-6) learning provision has to be an average of 4 hours provision daily.

Class teachers and LSAs will support remote learning as best they can, but there will need to be a consideration for the children that remain in school.

Please Note: This timetable will be delivered subject to the class teacher being well and able to deliver learning. If a teacher is unwell, classes may have to be linked to another class and worked in 'tandem' in order to provide learning.

Home-schooling advice

Home-schooling is very different to school. It is much better to do things little and often. Your child's class teacher will create a timetable for you (see above), but remember you can adapt this to suit the needs of your child and your household.

- 1. Create a safe space for learning with all the equipment they will need.
- 2. Have a consistent routine in place, including start and end times for the day, lunch and break times.
- 3. Split work up into manageable chunks.
- 4. Take regular rest breaks and drink plenty of water.
- 5. Limit screen time and try to be active.
- 6. Make it fun, trying to incorporate your child's interests as much as possible.
