| Attendance $93 \%-95.9 \%$ | Close to meeting Sherdley's expectations. We <br> would ask you to limit any further absences or <br> arrange appointments outside of school hours, <br> where possible. |
| Attendance 91\%-92.9\% | If your child falls into this category they are at <br> risk of becoming a persistent absentee. A <br> persistent absentee is classed by the <br> government as a student who misses 10\% or <br> more of school. |
| Attendance 90\% and below | If your child's attendance is below 90\% they are <br> classed as a persistent absentee. Depending on |

| could be at risk of a local authority fine or in |  |
| some cases a local authority prosecution. |  |

We have seen an increase in children being absent from school with coughs and colds. Please read the guidance below from Professor Chris Whitty; Chief Medical Officer, England related to mild illness and school attendance:

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of $38^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ or above.

If your child requires over the counter or prescription medication, a form can be completed to give permission to administer at school.

At Sherdley, parents and carers may be asked to provide medical evidence before an absence is authorised: however, this will only be requested if there is any genuine and reasonable doubt about the authenticity of the illness and/or your child is considered a persistent absentee.
